Great news – we have a new Safe House with a garden

Our Vice-President, John Woods visited Sri Lanka in April 2023.

This is his story of a very busy trip

(As per our rules, any committee member visiting Sri Lanka pay for their own flights and accommodation)

<u>Welcome dinner</u> John arrived on the 14th April which is New Years Day in Sri Lanka and a very important day in their culture. The girls in the safe house hold their own ceremony in the home to welcome the new year at a set time of the day.

It is custom in Sri Lanka for families to purchase a new outfit for the celebrations and every year Karuna provides a new outfit to the children and families we help.

John was treated to an amazing lunch at the safe house and was very impressed with the way the girls have settled in and keep the house very clean and tidy. He was very happy to see Dexter, (the dog John bought and maintains for the girls) was enjoying having a garden to run around in. We have also bought some new furniture and the girls now have their own wardrobes, as well as a big dining table and chairs which they can also use for



studying.





In the 18 months since we have funded the safe house it has been a big success. The girls are all now settled in study programs and job opportunities as well as feeling safe and cared for.

We are proud to see them enjoying life in this way.



Visit to meet Dileka

John has worked with Dileka from England to help her through a rough time mentally. Alongside this counselling we have found her a nice, safe boarding house where Dileka feels she is part of a family and she sent us a video of her room as she was so proud to be living in a decent home.

We also helped her find a steady job and she is now

enjoying life at long last. She is a very bright young lady and always has a big smile despite a tough upbringing. We have also enrolled her in a month long intensive English school due to start in September, with a hospitality course to follow.

Sachini and her children were very happy to see John, Shashi, Sathya, Piyuma, Sanduni & Ishara when they visited her. Sachini lives in a very small one room house with her husband and 2 children on the in-law's property. She



has a hard life, with not a lot of support from her husband and family which is sad to see.

We visit once a month and take some dry foods, sanitary products and medicines for the children to make life easier.

John visited Sachini twice as it was her birthday and also took Ageesha and Dileka with him as they were all at the orphanage together. Ageesha had not seen Sachini for around 5 years so there were lots of tears on reunion. John also arrived with a

lovely birthday cake which was a big surprise and something Sachini would not normally receive. We support her as much as we can.



Visit to Pradeepa. John and the girls were then able to meet Pradeepa

who lives a few hours away from Galle in a rural area. The girls were all very close at Yasodara so it was a fun visit. Pradeepa is now married to a soldier and lives with her motherin-law. Her husband only has leave from the army for 10 days every 3 months. She works 7 days a week in a shop to donate her wages to the family fund. Pradeepa had very Pradeep good grades at school so we are hoping to help her re-start her study and create a better life for herself.

Moravinna Children's Home in Pandura. John was able to visit Moravinna Childrens Home in Panadura with Shashi and the girls in our safe house. The children in the home were very welcoming and the 4 girls from our safe house formed an instant bond with each other as they know exactly how life is lived after years at Yasodara children's home.



After meeting the children and matrons who run the home and delivering food, we were able to discuss the needs of the home. We were able to return a second time with 6 pedestal fans for the bedroom areas to help keep the rooms cooler in such a hot climate.



We also delivered requested dry foods and treats on both visits. Karuna now visits monthly and the safe house girls continue to grow a friendship and really enjoy the visits too.

The Manacare Foundation Orphanage After Karuna had visited and met Joy from Manacare on our last visit in November 2022, John was able to meet her this time.

Joy is a very busy lady with varied projects within the Manacare grounds- she works with many special needs and disabled local children and families to which Karuna donates every month to help pay for the physiotherapist. There is a young girl Oneka who is unable to walk and we have assisted to buy her splints, which will help strengthen her leg muscles with the dream

that one day she will walk on her own accord.



Joy also has a Montessori school for the nearby village children.

Manacare accept volunteers from around the world to help day to day with any skills they have and Joy also employs local ladies from the nearby village to make soaps and towels which are then sold to hotels to help fund Manacare <u>Maheesha</u> - has been living in Childrens Corner Orphanage since Yasodara closed. We visit her often and she has become a model student and just completed her O level exams. We have helped her

older sister Chamodi to start a small shop in her village with her

husband. We have also found them a rental house so that Maheesha can move in with Chamodi.

We will continue to assist Maheesha and help further her studies to hopefully give her a bright future.

Bashini – John's timing in Sri Lanka also coincided with Bhashini having a baby girl! Everyone enjoyed the visit especially the girls who got to have a cuddle. We arranged to help fix the bedroom roof on Bhashini's house and delivered some baby care products as well.

We look forward to our next visit this year to see how the bub has grown. Shashi continues to visit every month so Karuna can help with any needs.
